


CARLOS CHAVEZ COMPOSER-CONDUCTOR

CARLOS CHAVEZ HAS BEEN A PROLIFIC FORCE ON THE CONTEMPORARY MUSIC SCENE. HIS CONTRIBUTION ENCOMPASSES EVERY TYPE OF COMPOSITION, FROM CHAMBER MUSIC TO OPERA, CONCERTO TO AVANTGARDE EXPERIMENTS, BALLET TO FOLK ARRANGEMENTS. HE IS NOT ONLY THE MOST DISTINGUISHED SYMPHONIST IN LATIN AMERICA, BUT HAS BROUGHT THE VIBRANT MUSIC OF LATIN AMERICA TO THE WORLD.

WHILE CARLOS CHAVEZ IS KNOWN INTERNATIONALLY AS A COMPOSER AND FOUNDER-CONDUCTOR OF THE NATIONAL SYMPHONY OF MEXICO, TO HIS COUNTRYMEN HIS ACHIEVEMENTS AS DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINE ARTS OF THE SECRETARIAT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION, AND DIRECTOR OF THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF FINE ARTS ARE ALSO REMARKABLE AND HAVE HAD REVOLUTIONARY IMPACT UPON MEXICAN CULTURAL LIFE.
